## **DEPARTING FROM SINAI**

- 1. The great and terrible wilderness.
  - 1. The time of Israel's departure was 20th day of the 2nd month of the 2nd year after they left Egypt.
  - 2. The distance from Sinai to Kadesh-Barnea, the southern border of Canaan, was a journey of 11 days.
    - 1. It was a massive group of people, with both families and cattle.
    - 2. The formation of the march was set (chapter 2).
    - 3. The princes of the 12 tribes had given six covered wagons for the tabernacle (7:1-3).
  - 3. The immediate path from Sinai (Horeb) was most forbidding (Deut. 1:19).
    - 1. Re. the geography, it is mostly plain of sand and gravel, but it is broken by some valleys.
    - 2. Also, this put them among enemies: were hedged between the Edomites and Amalekites and before them the Amorites.
- 2. God's provision for them.
  - 1. First, He continued all the other provisions:
  - 2. There was the message of care given in the silver trumpets (10;5,6).
    - 1. The trumpets had various functions:
    - 2. The sound of the trumpet meant that "ye shall be remembered before Jehovah your God" (9b, 10b).
  - 3. God provided Hobab, Moses' brother-in-law, as a guide (29-32).
  - 4. There was the special words Joses was to speak whenever they began and ended a day of marching.
    - 1. When they stopped, Moses would said, "Rise up, Jehovah, and let Their enemies be scattered; and let them that hate Thee flee before Thee (35; Ps. 68:1).
    - 2. As they stopped Moses again called God to return to the thousands of Israel (36; Ps. 132:8).
