GOD'S ONLY BEGOTTEN SON

- 1. The evidence.
- 1. When Jesus came near us and became like us, then it was so easy to deny that He was divine, the Son of God.
- 2. Scripture clearly and emphatically speaks of Jesus' deity: Romans 9:5 and I Timothy 3:16.
- 1. Jesus had divine attributes.
- 2. And He did divine works.
- Even in His humiliation He was recognized as the "Son of God" (Jn 1:34, 49; Matt. 16:15-18; John 20:28).
- That Jesus is the Son of God is extremely important.
- 1. We must insist on the language, "the only begotten Son of God."
- 2. Christ's sonship is unique especially because He is "begotten."
- 1. Begotten is the act of love whereby one reproduces oneself in another.
- 2. Because God Himself in our flesh sheds His life's blood, then the cross is surely efficacious.
- His Sonship is "only;" distinct from the sonship of angels and from Adam (Luke 3:38).
- 1. He is only because He alone is the Person of the eternal Son of God.
- 2. And Jesus is only because He alone is the natural Son of God.
- Only in and through Christ can we confess that we too are God's children.
- 1. In Christ God graciously adopted us and gave us the glorious privilege of being called the sons of God.
- 2. Our adoption into God's family is only and always by grace.
- 1. First, by virtue of our creation we are naturally human.
- 2. Second, legally, and spiritually we are children of the devil (Eph. 2:2,3).

- 3. Third, it is grace because even after our adoption we are disobedient and runaways.
- We are legally adopted.
- Spiritually, the Son of God has the power to make us God's children in reality (not step-children).
