## Psalm 75; Lord's Day 36

## THE RIGHT USE OF GOD'S NAME

- 1. God's name.
  - 1. God's name is His revelation of Himself to man (Psalm 75:1; 72:19; Acts 4: 12; Romans 10:13).
    - 1. Each of God's names and all of them together are part of His special revelation in Scripture.
    - 2. Through God's names we are able to know Him.
    - 3. Jesus is God's best revelation, graciously saving a people from sin (Acts 4:12).
  - 2. To take is to carry, because God has put His name on and in the elect, so we carry it (II Chron. 7:14).
    - 1. God's names are His gifts to mankind and they are not to be treated as common.
    - 2. When we live improperly, we give opportunity for God to be blasphemed (Titus 2:5b,8b,10b; Isa. 48:1,2).
- 2. This commandment would have us use God's name only in awe and with the greatest honor.
  - 1. In vain means that we empty the name of the honor He deserves.
  - 2. All mis-use of God's name dishonors Him: profanity, cursing, false swearing, sorcery, rash interjections, silence.
  - 3. God is highly insulted when His name is misused or abused.
    - 1. Emphatically stated: all violators are not...guiltless.
    - 2. The penalty is nothing less than death (Leviticus 24:15).
- 3. We must use God's name with fear and reverence, honoring Him.
  - 1. The reason is because God is the only good, the absolute holiness.
  - 2. We must render to God our worship, both publicly and privately.
  - 3. Our chief good and enjoyment consists in glorifying Him and our chief end is to know and praise God forever.
  - 4. We rightly use God's name when we thank Him.
