I Thessalonians 4; Lord's Day 41

HOLY AND PURE LIVING

- 1. The calling to purity.
 - 1. God created man pure, so that they were naked and not ashamed (Gen. 2: 25).
 - 1. Man's fall into sin was experienced by their being ashamed of their nakedness (Gen. 3:7)
 - 2. When Adam and Eve sought to divorce themselves from God, it had bitter consequences, also on their relationship.
 - 2. God promised redemption from sin s shame when He made coats of skin and covered them (Gen. 3:21).
 - 1. In Christ God provides for each and everyone of His people the real marriage of Christ and the church.
 - 2. Thus marriage is honorable and the bed undefiled (Heb. 13:4), picturing the real marriage (Eph. 5:32).
 - 3. The bride/church is called to be devoted to her Husband, reflecting His purity by abstaining from fornication (3).
 - 1. God remains the holy and pure One, and He is completely faithful to His covenant people.
 - 2. His grace enables the redeemed to reflect His purity and faithfulness.
- 2. God condemns adultery, all unfaithfulness and every uncleanness.
 - 1. Adultery is unfaithfulness on the part of a husband or wife, and it is sexual activity before marriage.
 - 2. All uncleanness is accursed of God (Lev. 18:27).
 - 1. Whosoever defiles the temple of God, him will God destroy (I Cor. 3: 17).
 - 2. God promises His wrath against all whoremongers and adulterers (Heb. 13:4; Rev. 21:8).
 - 3. What God curses, we must detest with all our hearts.
- 3. Everyone redeemed is called to reflect Jesus in grateful purity and faithfulness.
 - 1. Each mate must labor (in gratitude to God, not to their mate) never to cease to do their part to do what God commands.
 - 1. Each mate must remember the unconditional vows they made to God and to the other.
 - 2. God always has more grace than we have sins, both to forgive and to enable us to be pure.
 - 2. Be motivated by thoughts of God s goodness to us as Joseph (Gen. 39:9).
